The way it works: CafePress charges a base rate for a given item and an up charge for the printing of one logo. If an item has two logos, there's an additional charge. We set a royalty level which is our profit that is added to the previous cost and shipping is added. Once we reach an established level of royalties, Cafepress sends us a check. You can pay with your credit card, Amazon.com or Pay-Pal accounts.

Military Etiquette

As you all know we perform at the pleasure of the Commandant, and it is a great privilege indeed. We must continually self-police ourselves in order to ensure that we stay "squeaky clean" and are represented by all members in the most positive light. This is absolutely essential to ensure the long-term success of the band.

Some band members are "military" members and some are not. However, we are all members of a military pipe band representing one of the armed forces of the United States. Therefore, we must adhere to proper military etiquette requirements whenever we are representing the band, whether in uniform or not. For example, once you arrive at Grand Haven for a Coast Guard Festival you are representing the USCG until the moment you leave, whether you are in uniform or not.

When a senior official makes his/her way towards an area where the band has assembled, it is the responsibility of the band leaders to greet the official. Military etiquette dictates that a junior will only address a senior with the proper greeting of the day such as, "Good evening Admiral." The junior should not extend his hand for a hand shake to the senior. If the senior extends his hand for a hand shake the junior will return the hand shake. Should the senior initiate a conversation with the junior, the junior should engage in light conversation that does not concern personal, career or business issues. Remember the old Japanese proverb, "The tongue is only three inches long, yet it can kill a man six feet high." Let's be careful not to kill the band with our tongues.

USCG Pipe Band Identification Badge

Last year, a new measure was introduced to distinguish members who have participated in Pipe Band events on a regular basis. The "ID Badge" is issued to members in person who met the criteria. The current criteria is for a member to participate in one national event, or two local events per calendar year. Each badge is individually numbered, & assigned to the member, & must be returned to the band if they don't meet this criteria in the following year. The badge is be worn centered on the right pocket of either the tropical blue shirt or Service Dress Blue Coat.

DO YOU KNOW, who is BMC Mike Mone, USCG (Ret)?

I was born in Dover, N.H., the fifth child of eight children in my family. May parents were Charles and Celeste (Graziani) Mone.

I first learned to play the bagpipes in 1968 while I was still in high school. I was a member of the Granite State Highlander Pipe and Drums from Dover. It was at this time that Pat Boyle, his father Barney, and his Uncle Tom all took me under their wing. I continued to play when I joined the Army with the 304th Regiment Pipe Band, part of the 76th Division out of Rochester, N.H. Pat and I were drill sergeants at the time and in our spare time; we started a small band of about eight pipers and a couple of drummers who were all part of our unit. I was honorably discharged from the Army as an E-7 at this time married Sheila Duffy, my classmate from grammar school!

I help the privilege of being the only bagpiper authorized to wear the Coast Guard uniform, modified with the kilt, in the First Coast Guard District from 1974 to my retirement in 1994. I performed for Tip O'Neil's funeral in Boston on the State House steps, on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C., at Arlington National Cemetery, the Vietnam Memorial Wall, on the U.S. Coast Guard Bark "Eagle", on the USS Constitution in Boston and throughout my career, at many retirements and change of commands throughout the United States.

After my retirement from the Coast Guard in 1994, I was the first piper for the Manchester New Hampshire Ancient Order of Hibernians. I also belong to the NH Police Pipe and Drum band and the United States Coast Guard Pipe Band. I am now retired from the N.H. State Court system as a Court Security Officer. My wife Sheila and I have three wonderful grown children. Timothy is a graduate of Massachusetts Maritime Academy where he was Senior Class President. He currently works as a New Hampshire police officer. Maura is a graduate of McGill University in Montreal and attended the University of Leeds in England, where she received her Master's in Disability Studies. Our youngest Elizabeth graduated from New Hampshire Technical College with a degree in Human Services. She is currently working for the New Hampshire Administrative Office of the Courts in the Family Curt Division. Although the children are all grown and only one is still living at home, I miss their company from time to time and sometimes wish they all were living back home.
